Message from Local Court Chaplain

Dear Catholic Daughters of the Americas and their families,

Dec. 7, 2021

Our secular culture isn't very good at waiting in anticipation. Even as early as Thanksgiving we have heard Christmas songs on the radio. Unfortunately, after Christmas day, our secular culture will forget all about Christmas. But for us Catholic Christians we have been preparing for Christmas during the holy season of Advent, and we have been resisting the urge to celebrate Christmas before it is time. For us, Christmas does not begin and end on December 25th. There are more days to celebrate ... we have a whole season of Christmas! We have the special Octave of Christmas which we look forward to that continues into the twelve days of Christmas (made popular by the song); and these twelve days are meant to go until the Epiphany, and then the Christmas season continues on until the Baptism of the Lord, so Christmas is indeed a rich liturgical season. In addition to the Christmas days, there are some important feast days within the Christmas season: Dec. $26^{th} = St$. Stephen the protomartyr, Dec. $27^{th} = St$. John the Apostle (however, since Sunday falls on the 27^{th} this year, we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family, the first Sunday after Christmas), Dec. $28^{th} = The$ Holy Innocents, and finally Jan. $1^{st} = Solemnity$ of Mary the Mother of God (a holy day of obligation). I encourage you to make an effort to celebrate these great feasts in some way. You might come to the Mass as a way to celebrate, or if your schedule prevents you, try at least looking at the readings for those days, and pray with the Scriptures.

It is indeed a holy season!

Let us make the most of it!

I pray the Lord's blessings upon you and your family during these Holy Seasons of Advent and Christmas.

The Twelve Days of Christmas

From 1558 until 1829, Roman Catholics in England were not permitted to practice their faith openly. Someone during that era wrote this carol as a catechism song for young Catholics. It has two levels of meaning: the surface meaning plus a hidden meaning known only to members of their church. Each element in the carol has a code word for a religious reality which the children could remember.

- 1. The partridge in a pear tree was Jesus Christ.
- 2. Two turtle doves were the Old and New Testaments.
- 3. Three French hens stood for faith, hope and love.
- 4. The four calling birds were the four gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John.
- 5. The five golden rings recalled the Torah or Law, the first five books of the Old Testament.
- 6. The six geese a-laying stood for the six days of creation.
- 7. Seven swans a-swimming represented the sevenfold gifts of the Holy Spirit: Prophesy, Serving, Teaching, Exhortation, Contribution, Leadership, and Mercy.
- 8. The eight maids a-milking were the eight beatitudes.
- 9. Nine ladies dancing were the nine fruits of the Holy Spirit: Love, Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Goodness, Faithfulness, Gentleness, and Self Control.
- 10. The ten lords a-leaping were the Ten Commandments.
- 11. The eleven pipers piping stood for the eleven faithful disciples.
- 12. The twelve drummers drumming symbolized the twelve points of belief in the Apostles' Creed.

Dear Sisters in Christ,

We find ourselves once again in the season of Advent. This is the beginning of a new year of grace in our Church. A year of grace in which we journey with Christ as he comes into the world to lead us to the kingdom prepared for us in heaven.


