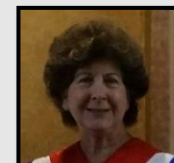

***A MESSAGE FROM NEW STATE CHAPLAIN
REV. JAMES HERRERA***

Dear Catholic Daughters of America,

The month of October is dedicated to Our Lady of the Rosary due to the Feast day of Our Lady of the Rosary on October 7th which fall on a Monday this year. On Saturday, October 5th is the annual Rosary Bowl in the Archdiocese of Portland that will be held at the Oregon State Fair Grounds. So, we enter this month of October looking to Mary and her intercession for us as we continue our journey with and toward her Son, our Lord Jesus.

During the month of October, I have the custom since my days in the seminary to make an extra effort to pray the Rosary daily. I do usually try to fit in praying the rosary each day, but at times that does not always happen. As I pray these Rosary's in October, I of course remember all those that are dearest to me, my parish and the faithful that have been entrusted into my care, the Knights of Columbus and now of course the Catholic Daughters. I would encourage and ask that you join me in prayer the Rosary each day during the month of October, united our intentions together as we lift them up to our Blessed Month and as we reflect upon the life of Jesus and the journey that he made with us and for us in His earthly life.

Saint Pius V established this feast in 1573. The purpose was to thank God for the victory of Christians over the Turks at Lepanto—a victory attributed to the praying of the rosary. Clement XI extended the feast to the universal Church in 1716.

The development of the rosary has a long history. First a practice developed of praying 150 Our Fathers in imitation of the 150 Psalms. Then there was a parallel practice of praying 150 Hail Mary's. Soon a mystery of Jesus' life was attached to each Hail Mary. Though Mary's giving of the rosary to Saint Dominic is recognized as a legend, the development of this prayer form owes much to the followers of Saint Dominic. One of them, Alan de la Roche, was known as "the apostle of the rosary." He founded the first Confraternity of the Rosary in the 15th century. In the 16th century, the rosary was developed to its present form—with the 15 mysteries: joyful, sorrowful and glorious. In 2002, Pope John Paul II added five Mysteries of Light to this devotion.

The purpose of the rosary is to help us meditate on the great mysteries of our salvation. Pius XII called it a compendium of the gospel. The main focus is on Jesus—his birth, life, death, and resurrection. The Our Fathers remind us that Jesus' Father is the initiator of salvation. The Hail Mary's remind us to join with Mary in contemplating these mysteries. They also make us aware that Mary was and is intimately joined with her Son in all the mysteries of his earthly and heavenly existence. The Glory Bes remind us that the purpose of all life is the glory of the Trinity.

The rosary appeals to many. It is simple. The constant repetition of words helps create an atmosphere in which to contemplate the mysteries of God. We sense that Jesus and Mary are with us in the joys and sorrows of life. We grow in hope that God will bring us to share in the glory of Jesus and Mary forever.

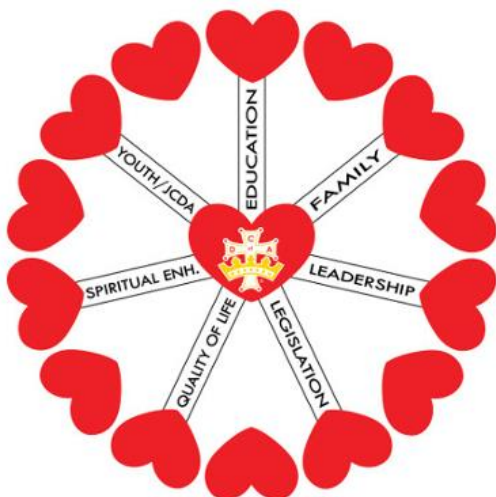

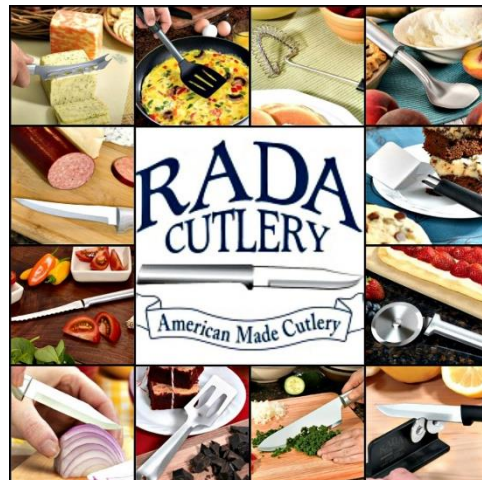
Calling all Bakers!
