

I hope that you all are doing well. We are moving toward Holy Week, but it is a preparation for Holy Week that is much different than I have ever encountered before. I am preparing liturgies that will have no people present, and I am trying to figure out how best to live-stream them.



These are, indeed, unprecedented times. And, I know that there is a great ache in your hearts at not being able to attend these liturgies in-person, and, there is a great ache in my heart not being able to be present to you during this time, but, nonetheless, I encourage you to enter into them spiritually and to follow them virtually on our Facebook page, if you are able.

This Holy Week is filled with many wonderful things. We of course begin with the Passion (or Palm) Sunday which celebrates Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem, and then very shortly later we read the passion account, of Jesus suffering and death ... quite a contrast!

Then the Masses during the week will prepare us for the Sacred Triduum (or three days). Normally, on Monday of Holy Week, the priests would gather with the Archbishop for a meal and the Chrism Mass, which would involve a renewal of our priestly promises; then, Wednesday of Holy Week is nicknamed "spy Wednesday" because of Judas' betrayal which we will hear about in the Gospel for that day.

We will live stream the Tuesday and Wednesday Masses at 12:15pm on our Facebook page.

On Holy Thursday, we have the Mass of the Last supper. We will live stream it at 7:00pm on our Facebook page. Normally, we would have the washing of the feet of some of the parishioners at the Mass to imitate what our Lord did on that evening, but that will be omitted. The evening would normally end with the Blessed Sacrament being taken to the altar of repose, and the altar is stripped, and everything is removed out of the sanctuary, preparing for our Lord's passion and death.

Good Friday, then is the only day of the year that Mass is not celebrated in the world. We will have Stations of the Cross at 12:15pm. Then a Good Friday service at 3:00pm, which is basically a liturgy of the word with veneration of the Cross, and the reception of communion that would have been consecrated on Holy Thursday. Both of these will be streamed live on the Facebook.

The Easter Vigil will begin at 8:30pm. We will have a lighting of the Easter fire and from that fire we will light the Easter Candle which will be taken up in procession to its place of honor. Then the Exsultet will be sung, a hymn that proclaims the great mystery that is before us. There will be several readings from Scripture that lay out for us the history of Salvation. Normally, the lights would be dimmed and then brought up at the time of the Gloria. Normally, we would bring people into the Church on that Blessed evening, but this year it will have to happen later. In any case, we will plan on live streaming that Mass at 8:30pm. Then for Easter Sunday, we will live stream an Easter Mass at 9:00am and 11:00am (Spanish).

I want you to know that I think of you often, and I am praying for you. I know that it is not the same when you have to watch or listen to Mass from home, but we are trying our best to keep you connected. God Bless you all!




